OCA CONSTITUTION

Designation. The name of the Group shall be "**The Airborne Signals Old Comrades Association**". (OCA).

Aims. The aims of the Group shall be to:

- To maintain a focal point for those who served in Airborne Signals.
- To provide a contact point between past and present Airborne Signals and arrange gatherings for them.
- To ensure that all qualifying soldiers and ex-soldiers are aware of the existence of the OCA and the opportunity to join.
- To maintain contact with all Airborne Signallers and offer comradeship, support and advice as appropriate and within the abilities of the Group.

In order to achieve its aims the Group shall:

- Raise money during reunions
- Open a bank account in its name
- Organise events
- Work with similar Groups and exchange information for the mutual benefit.

Membership. Membership is open to any former officer or soldier of Airborne Signals, who has:-

- Passed the Military Parachute selection course (P' Company).
- Qualified as a British Military Parachutist.
- Served on strength of an Airborne Unit.
- Never refused to Parachute.

All four requirements must be met to qualify as a member to the OCA. Associate membership may be granted to a wife or partner of a deceased member subject to confirmation by the committee.

Administration. The Group shall be administered by a Committee of five permanent members. The Officers of the Committee shall be Chairman, Vice Chairman, Treasurer, Secretary and Founder/Life Member.

The Duties of the Officers

Chairman shall - Chair meetings of the Committee and the Group. Represent the Group at functions/meetings that the Group has been invited to or nominate a suitable representative. Act as the spokesperson of the Group when necessary. Prepare an annual report/Newsletter.

Vice Chairman shall - deputise for the chairman. Assist the Chairman to produce an annual report/newsletter. Write Obituaries and articles for the Wire and Pegasus Magazines and liaise with Squadron Representative to prevent duplication.

Secretary shall - maintain an up to date membership list. Prepare the agenda for meetings. Produce minutes and circulate information to the group.

Treasurer shall – Control and supervise the financial affairs of the Group. Maintain the accounts and produce an account balance sheet for the AGM and Audit.

Founder/Life Member shall act in an advisory capacity.

Finance. All monies received by or on behalf of the Group shall be applied to further the aims of the Group. Cheques issued shall be signed by the Treasurer and Secretary.

Committee Members. Any OCA member may serve on the committee provided they are nominated by at least two ordinary members and subject to a show of hands at the annual general meeting. Committee members will usually serve for 2 years but may serve longer subject to confirmation by a show of hands at the annual general meeting.

Change to the Constitution. Any changes to this Constitution must be agreed by at least twothirds of members by voting at a meeting or by post.
